In March 2019 a pioneer study "*The Country Specific Culture Forum: Sweden*" was published, describing the results of the research on attributes of national culture that might impact the safety culture in the Swedish nuclear industry. The report and work brought us a better idea of how Swedes perceive their own culture – values and beliefs- and identify attitudes, based on them, in their work environment.

The next question might be how we can integrate this awareness in the safety culture program / system in our Organizations.

"*Safety Culture in Circles*", a methodology considered good practice in the Workshop on Global Safety Culture, National Factors Relevant to Safety Culture hold by IAEA (International Atomic Energy Agency) can be used as a valuable tool.

Each role / function can reflect on how they can contribute to create an even better and robust Safety Culture. It has shown to be an effective way to enhance awareness and accountability in the context of the uniqueness of our business on daily routine. In an interactive way the method helps participants to identify the interaction and impact of attributes and features from National, Organizational and their own team culture.

In Sweden this methodology has been applied in the operations training and qualification program at a Swedish nuclear power plant.
